International Day of Peace is on September 21! It is an opportunity to declare your home, school, community as a Peace Site. Here are some ideas for you:

Create a kick-off event to declare your organization a World Citizen Peace Site. This can be a simple gathering or something more elaborate. This is your public declaration that YOU are a Peace Site.
Have your site commit to regular meetings to monitor the progress of your action plan. Have a plan for an annual renewal to stay focused on the Five Peace Actions, and your sites' commitment to them. • Celebrate and publicize accomplishments and achievements and make a plan for the next goals. Have an annual celebration! Plant a tree, create a mural, frame a poster, design a flag, host a Peace Walk, write a song! Embrace your sites' creativity. (Some Peace Sites refer to this as their Rededication.)

• Encourage representatives from your site to attend World Citizen Peace Education. This is professional development and an opportunity to network with Peace minded individuals as well as other Peace Sites.

- Share your plans, goals, ideas, and action plans. This helps inspire others working towards the same goals and encourages others to become a Peace Site.
- Your collaboration and sharing helps others define their site as peace communities!

Our October 22 Peace Education session will focus open *Human Centered Design* with Ramon A. Pastrano IV, and *Human Trafficking* presented by Tamara Stark, Tubman Group



Dr. Pastrano is an architect of system change and human transformation. He founded Impact Lives in 2007 as a center for cultural competence, and as laboratory social responsibility and innovation. Through awareness based leadership and critical thinking, his model is designed to assist individuals and organizations in developing new frameworks from where to solve their most challenging problems. By critically reflecting on the social-cultural and geopolitical structures as a whole, his model helps to provide a better understanding of complex systems.

Tamara Stark leads development, research, and implementation of effective, entrepreneurial, and innovative programs in partnership with local and national initiatives to improve the lives of youth and families. She oversees curriculum development and prevention, intervention, outreach, and youth leadership programs in residential, school, and community settings. She works to build inclusive and responsive systems of care with diverse communities by participating in cross disciplinary efforts focused on positive youth and family development, violence prevention, and ending homelessness. She serves on various local boards and also represents Tubman on the governing boards for the Minnesota Coalition for Battered Women and the Minnesota Wom-

en's Consortium to enhance research, policy, and practice connections. She has participated in local and national peer leadership collaborations to improve regional program quality, equity, and resource development with and for underserved youth and families.
